## How To Create a YouTube Video

- 1. Type in **www.google.com**
- 2. On the far right top of the screen, you will see a square made up of nine little circles. This is called **Google Apps**. Click that little square icon.
- 3. You will see a list of applications. Scroll down to the one that says YouTube. Click it.
- 4. On the YouTube website, you will see a little icon that looks like a movie camera in the far right top corner of the screen. The icon is a square with a plus sign in the middle of it and a triangle touching the square. This is the **Create** icon. Click it.
- 5. You will see a page that has an icon on it a triangle inside a square. This is the **Upload Video** icon. Click it.
- 6. You will see an icon with a rectangle. Inside the rectangle are the words "**Select File**." Click that rectangular box. From here you need to find your recording (For me, I have my kids' recordings on a camera disk that I can find on my computer screen when I stick the disk in my computer).
- After you have selected your file, there will be a page to type in **Details**. Type "First Name Only performing Piece No. 1 by Composer, followed by Piece No. 2 by Composer." Example: "David performing "Clair de Lune" by Debussy followed by "Prelude No. 11, No. 1" by Liadov.
- 8. You can also select a Thumbnail picture that helps you identify your video. These have to be small files. You can either choose one that the computer selects for you, or from another file on your media device.
- 9. You will be asked about the Audience. Make sure you select "Yes, it's made for kids."
- 10. Click Next.
- 11. You will be asked about the Visibility. Make sure you select "Public."
- 12. You will be asked to **Publish.** Click that.
- 13. Make sure you write down the address of your video. Example: <u>https://youtu.be/uxBPR-716E4</u> That is what you need to send it to Vanessa Felhauer so she can send it to the judges.
- 14. Send your link to <u>vfelhauer72@gmail.com</u> and make sure you tell me who you are and what pieces are on your link. Example: "Hi Sonia, This is David. I'm sending you my youtube link for my Debussy and Liadov pieces. Let me know if you have any trouble opening the link."
